

# NOTICE

XXXXXXXXXX will be treated periodically throughout the summer of 2011 beginning in approximately Mid XXXXXXX. Please note that herbicide treatments are conducted in accordance with a permit issued by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ). At the time of treatment, signs will be posted along the shoreline within 100 feet of treatment areas that indicate what herbicides were used and use restrictions that apply. Below is a list of herbicides that may be used in the lake and associated use restrictions.

Active Ingredient / Product	Restrictions
2,4-D (Aquacide, Navigate)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) 24-hour restriction on swimming in treatment area.</li><li>(b) Do not use water from treated areas for irrigating plants or mixing sprays for agricultural or ornamental plants, unless an approved assay indicates the 2,4-D concentration is 100 ppb or less, or only growing crops and non-crop areas labeled for direct treatment with 2,4-D will be affected.</li><li>(c) Do not use water from treated areas for potable water (drinking water), unless an approved assay indicates the 2,4-D concentration is 70 ppb or less.</li></ul>
Copper (Copper Sulfate)	<b>None</b>
Copper (Chelated Copper Algaecides)	<b>None</b>
Copper (Chelated Copper Herbicides)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) 24-hour restriction on swimming in treatment area.</li></ul>
Diquat dibromide (Reward, Redwing)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) 24-hour restriction on swimming in treatment area.</li><li>(b) 1-day animal consumption of treated water.</li><li>(c) 3-day restriction on domestic water use and irrigation of turf and ornamentals (d) 5-day restriction on crop irrigation.</li></ul>
Endothall (Aquatol K, Hydrothol 191)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) 24-hour restriction on swimming in treatment area.</li><li>(b) 14-day restriction on using treated water for irrigation, agricultural sprays, or domestic purposes.</li></ul> <b>NOTE:</b> Extended restrictions on livestock watering and domestic uses may be required depending on dosage.
Fluridone (Sonar, Whitecap)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) 24-hour restriction on swimming in treatment area.</li><li>(b) 7-day restriction on watering established tree crops.</li><li>(c) 30-day restriction on watering established row crops/turf/plants, newly seeded crops/seedbeds or areas to be planted.</li></ul>
Glyphosate (AquaNeat, Avocet, Rodeo)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) 24-hour restriction on swimming in treatment area.</li><li>(b) Setback distances from potable water intakes.</li></ul>
Imazapyr (AquaPier, Habitat)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) 24-hour restriction on swimming in treatment area.</li><li>(b) Setback distances from potable water intakes.</li><li>(c) Do not use treated water for irrigation of any plants for 120 days. This restriction may be lifted if the imazapyr residue level is determined to be 1.0 part per billion or less by laboratory analysis.</li></ul>
Triclopyr (Renovate 3, Renovate OTF)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) 24-hour restriction on swimming in treatment area.</li><li>(b) Do not use treated water for irrigation of any plants, except established grasses for 120 days. This restriction may be lifted if the triclopyr level in the intake water is determined to be non-detectable by laboratory analysis.</li><li>(c) setback distances from potable water intakes.</li></ul>

The chemicals used for aquatic nuisance control are registered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Michigan Department of Agriculture. The potential for damage to fish and other non-target organisms is minimal provided that the product is used as directed on the product label and the permit.
